This list of caregivers changes frequently due to ongoing classes. Please check the revised date on the bottom left hand corner of the directory.

If a person has obtained licensure elsewhere, their level of licensure is listed as CNA (Certified Nursing Assistant), LPN (Licensed Practical Nurse) or RN (Registered Nurse). SHCT initially verifies the status of a graduate's credentials, but we do not guarantee that certification or licensure has been maintained. We encourage you to verify current licensure.

The following key identifies the abbreviation after each caregiver's name and indicates the level of training the caregiver completed:

ELDER PAL (EP): 25 hours training

PERSONAL CARE ASSISTANT (PCA): 25 hours

training

IN HOME ASSISTANT (IHA): 40 hours training

ALZHEIMER'S AND DEMENTIA TRAINING (AD):

16 hours training. Pre-Requisite IHA

HOME CARE ASSISTANT (HCA): 60 hours training.

Pre-requisite IHA & AD (or EP and PCA)

GERIATRIC HOME CAREGIVER (GHC): Completion

of all levels of training (116 hours)

Key Terms:

Respite: Will provide 24 hour care for multiple days to allow the primary caregiver complete rest and relief Live-In: Will provide 24 hour care; duration to be discussed

Fill-in: Will provide periodic relief

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Checklist for Hiring a Caregiver Caregiver Interview

What is your first impression of the applicant? Was the caregiver neatly dressed? Good hygiene? Friendly? Relaxed? Appears physically fit? Good eye contact?
Are you working somewhere now?noyes How many hours per week?
Why are you looking for work?
How long did you work at your previous job?
What were your responsibilities?
Why did you leave?
How would you describe your health? Do you have any physical limitations?
What is your backup plan if you are unable to come to work?
Have you used any recreational drugs in the last 5 years?
Have you had any felony convictions in the last 5 years?
Would you approve having a criminal background check or drug test as a condition of employment? (Ask the question even if you do not intend to follow through. The response itself may be revealing).
Describe the job responsibilities and determine if applicant could meet your / care recipients needs.
